1	Ordinary people have a role to play in the administration of justice. Consider this statement in connection with either magistrates or juries. [25]
2	Is it true that tribunals are always quicker and cheaper than courts? [25]
3	Using decided case law, assess the extent of the liability of the occupiers for persons coming on to their premises. [25]
4	There can be no valid contract without consideration. Discuss. [25]
5	Compare the role of the House of Lords as a final court of appeal with that of the Court of Appeal. Can we justify two courts of appeal? [25]
6	"My Lords, the only rule for the construction of Acts of Parliament is, that they should be construed according to the intent of the Parliament which passed the Act" Tindal CJ in <i>The Sussex Peerage Case (1844)</i> . With reference to this statement, assess the value of the various aids available to the court in the interpretation of statutes.
7	Discuss the defences of provocation and diminished responsibility and how they affect a charge of murder. [25]
8	Critically consider the factors which influence the court when deciding whether to impose a custodial sentence. [25]
9	John, aged 25, has been arrested for the theft of a computer. Describe the different courts which could try his case and analyse the factors that will influence their decisions. [25]
10	Evaluate the extent to which an employer can be held liable for the torts committed by an employee. [25]
