Ecotourism in Costa Rica

Costa Rica has been associated with ecotourism for a number of years. 26% of the land is given over to national parks, reserves and protected lands. There is much to see and do, with exotic birds and wildlife, a wide variety of marine species and the chance to stay in traditional accommodation with local people.
