- (a) in their homes [10]
- and (b) at festival times. [10]
- 5 What can Hindus learn from the different image-forms of Shiva about the god's power in the universe? [20]
- 6 Which of the avatars you have studied do you consider most important for Hindu belief and practice? [20]

- 7 (a) Describe the traditional duties of **one** of the Hindu varnas. [10]
- and (b) Explain why Hindus emphasise the distinction between 'varna' and 'jati'. [10]
- 8 Discuss reasons why moksha is regarded as the goal of life in Hinduism. [20]
- 9 'The Hindu religion upholds the values of marriage and parenthood.' Discuss with reference to the samskaras you have studied. [20]
